


# The Circle of Fifths



Starting with C-major / a-minor (no sharps or flats):  
 Add one sharp as you progress clockwise.  
 Add one flat as you progress counter-clockwise.

**D Major Scale -**

Scale Degrees - I ii iii IV V vi vii<sup>o</sup>

Each note of the major scale serves as the root of a chord. I, IV and V chords are major. ii, iii and vi chords are minor. The vii<sup>o</sup> chord is diminished.

**Clockwise - fifth intervals**  
**Counter-clockwise - fourth intervals**  
**Relative minor - 90 degrees clockwise**

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When playing in 4/4 time, note values and rhythmic values are similar in that they can be *subdivided* into shorter units. Starting with **whole** notes/beats and continuing with **half**, **quarter**, **eighth**, **sixteenth**, **thirty-second** and **sixty-fourth**. With four beats in a measure, there are ways of counting these different values which help us to keep track of tempo.

You probably won't use thirty-second notes often, but the count is the same as for sixteenth notes, but you play two notes/beats for every count.
